82% of L&C County's population lives in the Greater Helena Area

- Helena's share of Lewis & Clark County's employment & income is close to 90%
- As of Dec. 2020 Lewis and Clark county had a total of 35,277 in our Labor Force up 681 from 2019; We have 33,865 currently employed resulting in 4% (Dec. 31) unemployment or approx. 1412 unemployed.






Covid brought an all-time high of 10.7% UE rate in April 2020


- 2015 301 permits = \$33.3 million
- 2016 217 permits = \$94.8 million
- 2017 232 permits = \$28.9 million
- 2018 364 permits = \$43.65 million
- 2019 316 permits = \$42.3 million
- 2020 247 permits = \$22.5 million
- HOUSING STARTS (2020) IN CITY OF HELENA:
 - 39
- PLUS <u>260 permits for new septic systems</u> in the valley outside city limits (L&C County)



Of the Residential permits = _39_ total new residences Single Family Dwellings (within city limits)

> 83 new <u>multi-family</u> Dwellings (within city limits)(duplexes, tri-plexes, four-plex, etc.)Nearly double the 2019 amount)







- Down 61% (covid) from 2019 (92,019 passengers - on and off
- Nationally ave. was down 79%
- New Terminal building completed.

<u>TOURISM – Helena Hotels – 2020</u>

- Occupancy was down 37%
- Average Daily Rate was down 10% \$88.26
- Total Revenue down 43% to \$19.7 Million after being over \$36 Million in 2019– (Highest ever) Smith Travel Research Report



> Business Survey Notables:

When asked "how was your business impacted negatively by the pandemic?"

- * 48.6% noted that mandates by L&C Health Dept. impacted their bottom-line.
- * 49% noted that schools not being open 5 days a week + lack of daycares had great impact.
- * 41% said their supply chains were interrupted.
- * 29% had to decrease their staff
- * 32% lost productivity due to staff contracting Covid-19



Business Survey Notables: During Covid-19 in 2020 - their business:

76% received PPP Funds

- 19% received EIDL Funds
- > 30% received stimulus funds from the State
- > 14% did not qualify for pandemic funding
- > 8% got private funding
- > 13.5% had a good year w/o assistance
